

## Keeping Children Safe is Everyone's Responsibility

Our school has a duty to safeguard and promote the welfare of all of our children. This means that we have safeguarding and child protection policies and procedures in place, in line with Torbay Safeguarding Children Partnership. All adults working at Oldway, including staff, volunteers, visitors, kitchen staff, and trainee teachers, must ensure that they are aware of our school procedures for sharing concerns.

Sometimes, we may need to share information and work in partnership with other agencies when there are concerns about a child's welfare. We will always ensure that our concerns about pupils are discussed with their parents/carers first unless we have reason to believe that this is not in the child's best interests or a child is at significant risk of harm or in immediate danger.
