1 WHO CAN BRING A PHONE?



No phones allowed for children in EYFS, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4.

Children must be dropped off and collected by an adult.



YEAR 5 AND YEAR 6

May bring a phone only if they walk to / from school unaccompanied AND parental consent has been given.

2 YEAR 5 & 6 RULES



Parental consent form must be completed before bringing a phone to school.



Turn phone completely off before coming onto the school site.



Phone will be stored securely in the classroom all day.



You will get your phone back at the end of the school day.

Phones must stay off and in bags until you have left the school gates.

3 WHY WE HAVE THIS POLICY

Travel to School

Our school has been selected to take part in an important government evaluation looking at **walking, wheeling and cycling to school**. The project is being carried out by the **National Centre for Social Research (NatCen)** on behalf of **Active Travel England (ATE)**. The findings will help inform future work and policies aimed at making active travel to school easier and safer for children.

Who can take part?

We are inviting **parents and carers of children in Reception, Year 1, Year 5 and Year 6** to complete a short online survey.

Your child **does not need to regularly walk, wheel or cycle to school** for you to take part. The survey is interested in everyone's experiences and views. If you have more than one child in an eligible year group, you can complete the survey **once for each eligible child**.

What will the survey ask?

The survey takes around **10 minutes** to complete and will ask about:

- How you and your child travel to and from school.
- What makes it easier or more difficult to walk, wheel or cycle to school.
- Your views on possible changes that could help children travel actively to school.

There are **no right or wrong answers**, and taking part is completely voluntary.

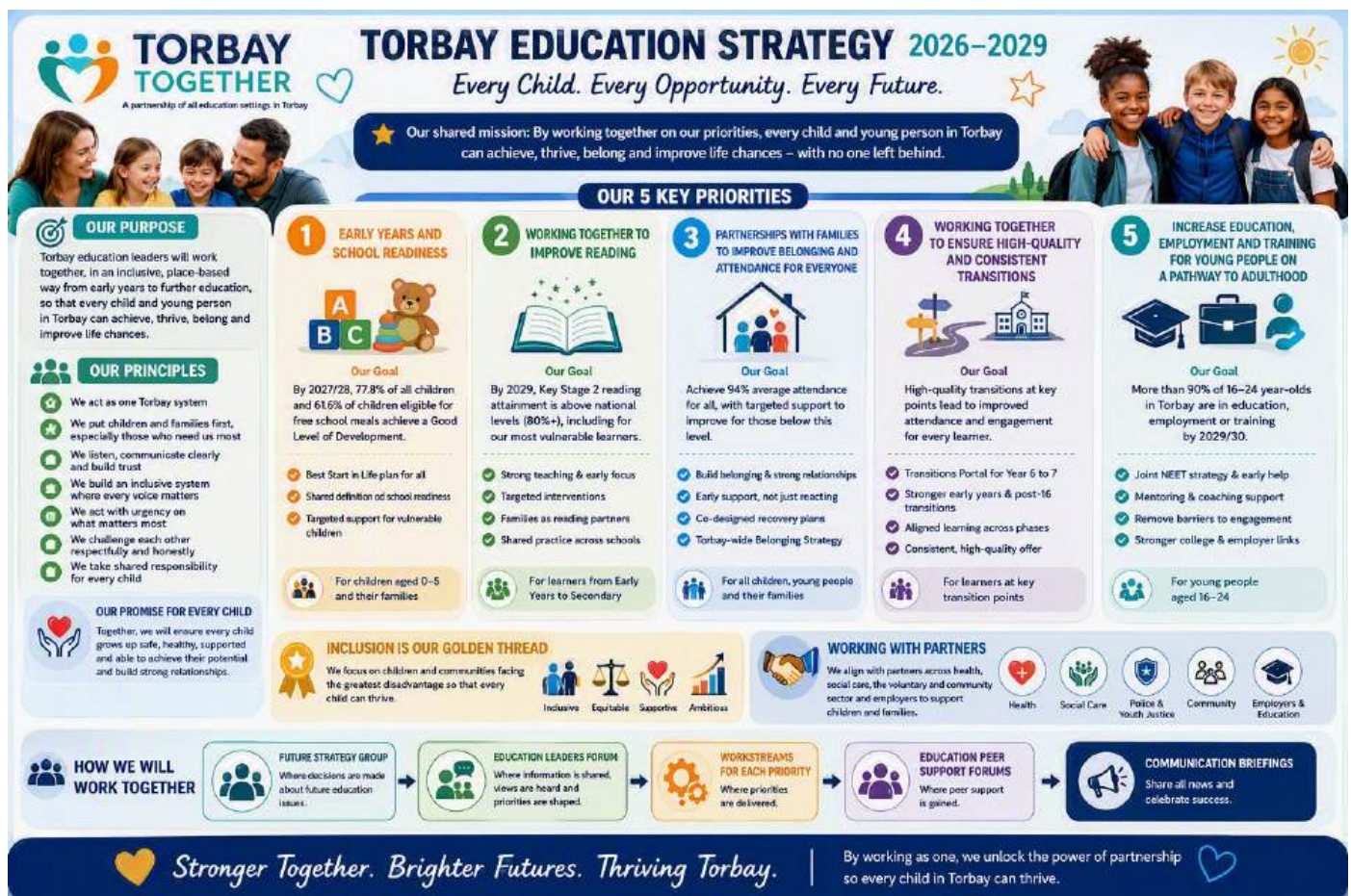
New Education Strategy for Torbay

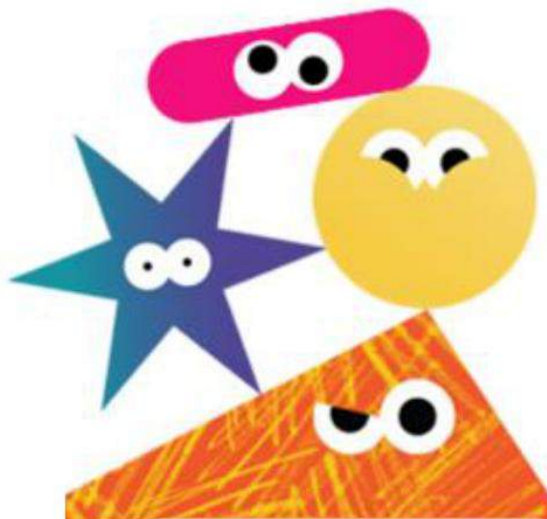

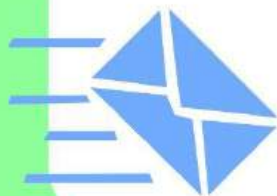

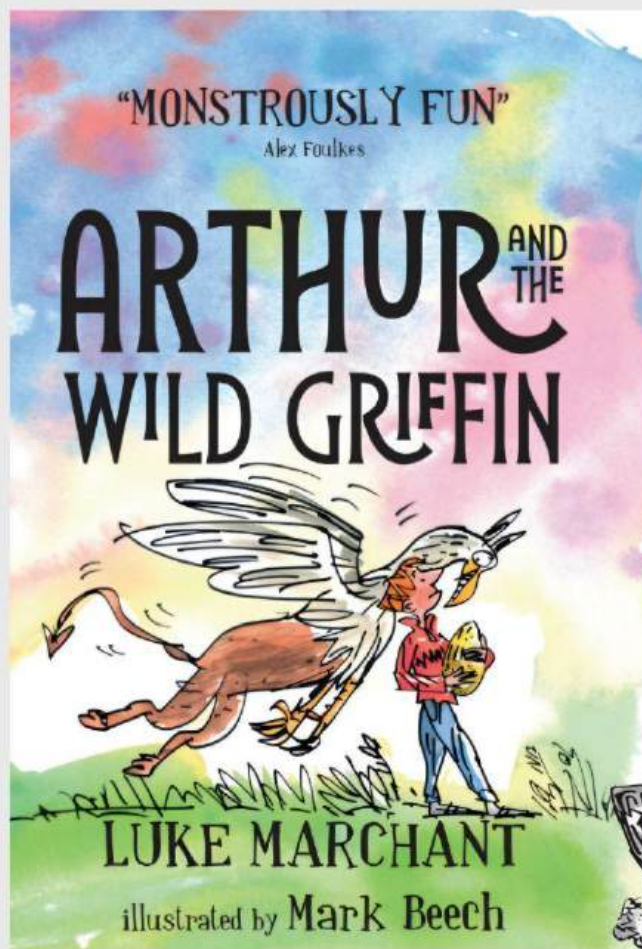

Attendance & Punctuality

Making sure your child goes to school on time is really important for their learning. If they're late a lot, it can cause some issues.

It's important for children to be on time for school because it helps them do their best in learning. Being punctual means forming good habits for the future. So, it's a big deal that your child gets to school on time.

Here's the deal: according to the Department for Education's rules, there's a specific time in the morning when schools stop marking who's there. If your child shows up after that time, they won't just get a late mark – they'll be marked as absent (*unauthorised absence*) for the whole morning.

If your child is late because of something important, like a doctor's appointment, the school will understand that. However, if there's no good reason, they'll mark it as an unauthorised absence.

So, it's best to be on time! Here are some things you might want to know:

Why does my child get marked absent for the whole morning even if they came before lunch? If your child arrives after a certain time in the morning, the school has to mark them absent (unauthorised absence) for the whole morning. It's a rule they have to follow.

Can I get a fine if my child is late a lot? Yes, if your child has 10 or more times of being late (unauthorised absences) without a good reason, you might get a fine.

It seems a bit strict that my child gets a late mark if they are just a couple of minutes late. Schools have rules about being on time, and being even a little late can count as not being on time. It's important to try to leave early to avoid being late.

What if our whole family overslept, and it's not my child's fault? Even if it's not your child's fault, being late because of oversleeping is still counted. They might get a late mark or be marked as absent (unauthorised absence), depending on how late they are.

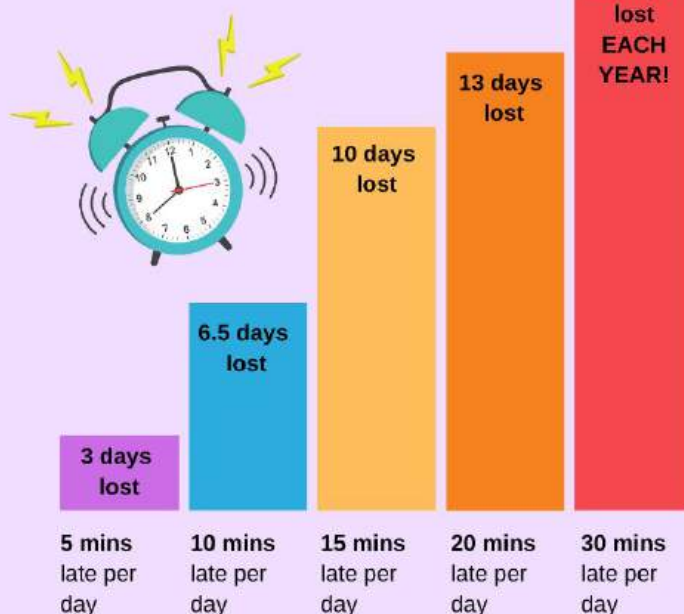
What if there's a traffic jam or something else that's not my fault? The school usually can't change the rules for one person, but if there's a big problem, like heavy snow causing delays for many people, they can make allowances.

What if I tell the school my child will be late? Do they still get a late mark? Yes, they might still get a late mark, but it's good if you tell the school. They'll know you're aware, and it helps if you say when your child will arrive and why they're late.

Do I have to tell the school if I know my child will be late? It's really helpful if you do. If your child is very late, telling the school might help them understand why and maybe say it's okay.

What if I am trying to get my child to school on time but they don't want to go? If your child is refusing to go to school on time, you can contact the school. They have a team that can work out why and maybe help your child and you.
